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# Subcontract Data

- Data comes from usaspending.com, which gets the data from fsrs.goc which is different from esrs.gov which is used for reporting by primes that have a subcontract requirement
- It is self-reported by companies
- Sometimes includes compensation data

Fedmine links the subcontract data to the prime contract at the task order level

# Types of Subcontract Requirements

The FPDS contract data indicates whether a contract has a subcontract requirement.

The various types include:

**Plan Not Included** – No Subcontracting Possibilities - A Subcontracting Plan was not included in the contract because subcontracting possibilities do not exist (FAR 19.705-2I)

**Plan Not Required** – No Subcontracting Plan was required. (For example, the action did not meet the dollar thresholds in FAR 19.702(a))

**Plan Required - Incentive Not Included** - Includes a Subcontracting Plan, but does not include additional incentives. This value is end dated as of May 1, 2015.

**Plan Required - Incentive Included** - Includes a Subcontracting Plan and also includes additional incentives This value is end dated as of May 1, 2015.

**Plan Required (Pre 2004)** - Plan Required (Pre 2004)

**Individual Subcontract Plan** - Applies to a specific contract with goals that covers the entire contract period, including option periods (FAR 19.701)

**Commercial Subcontract Plan** - "Commercial plan" means a Subcontracting Plan (including goals) that covers the offerer's fiscal year and that applies to the entire production of commercial items sold by either the entire company or a portion thereof (e.g., division, plant, or product line)

**DOD Comprehensive Subcontract Plan** - A Subcontracting Plan based on a plant, division, or company-wide basis. This value is only valid for DoD

# Subcontract Data

- Find prime contracts/awards that have a subcontract requirement
- Search for Subcontracts
  - Filters include keywords, agencies
  - GWACs/Schedules
- Salary Data in Company Profiles, use for G&A
